

**THE ACTING JUDGES ACT, 1867**

**ACT NO. XVI OF 1867**

[1st March, 1867]

**An Act to authorize the making of acting appointments to certain Judicial Offices.**

WHEREAS the <sup>1</sup>[President], is empowered by divers enactments to appoint the Judges of certain Courts in <sup>2</sup>[Bangladesh]: And whereas it has been doubted whether he <sup>3</sup>[\* \* \*] is empowered to appoint persons to act temporarily as such Judges, and it is expedient to remove such doubts; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

Preamble

1. In every case in which the <sup>4</sup>[President], has power under any Act or Regulation to appoint a Judge of any Court,

Power to appoint acting Judges

such power shall be taken to include the power to appoint any person capable of being appointed a permanent Judge of such Court, to act as Judge of the same Court for such time as the <sup>5</sup>[President], shall direct. Every person so appointed to act temporarily as a Judge of any such Court shall have the powers and perform the duties which he would have had and been liable to perform in case he had been duly appointed a permanent Judge of the same Court.

2. Every such Act and Regulation shall be construed as if it contained a special clause to the purport or effect of the first section of this Act.
